- "Foundationalist" Topic-Sequences
 - o e.g.: Unit 1: Epistemology, Unit 2: Metaphysics, ... [much later]: Ethics
 - o Common
- Intro Phil education:
 - Content
 - Skills/Methods
- Case from Skills/Methods Development (for opening with Ethics)
 - Option A: Opening Unit: Skills/Methods (e.g., logic) without Phil Content
 - Turns-off some students (risks locking-in disengagement)
 - Option B: Opening Unit: Skills/Methods with Phil Content
 - Which Content?
 - Since Skills/Methods throughout course, the Opening Unit should be...
 - the one most conducive to Skills/Methods development
 - = unit whose concepts students have most facility with & are generally most familiar with
 - \bullet = Ethics
 - vs. Epistemology
 - o e.g., conceptual analysis: cases of 'knowledge' vs. 'fairness'
 - Learning unfamiliar methods using unfamiliar content
 - Inclusion considerations
- Case from Engagement (for opening with Ethics)
 - o Content students are most predisposed to engage—i.e., Ethics—should come first
 - Set engagement precedent
 - Content less predisposed to engage—e.g., Epistemology— should come later
 - Receive biggest engagement boost from experience and Skill/Method development during course
- Considering the Cases from Skills/Methods Development & Engagement, Intro Phil should open with Ethics and cover Epistemology last

How Far into Intro Phil Textbooks until the Ethics Chapter? Average = 56%

E.g., if Ethics is the 3rd chapter out of 4, total, then Ethics starts 50% of the way into the textbook (not 75%). The **sample** consists of Intro Phil textbooks in the online catalogues [May 2020] of Cengage, McGraw-Hill, Oxford University Press, and Routledge. Excludes chronological textbooks (e.g., 1st ancient, 2nd medieval, etc.). Amount of primary source readings (i.e., is a "reader") does not affect inclusion.
